- Roxanne Landin: We are doing weekly grab-n-go craft kits. So many crafts. Our families are very appreciative of our craft kits. We average about 45 a week
- Autumn @ Reynolds: I'm really excited to do bleach tie dye video for teens and tweens this week!
- Newaygo Library: Newaygo Library has a Teen Metal Detector class coming up. We got a grant for metal detectors, so we're having a class with a teacher from the History Museum, and then we can check the Metal Detectors out to people!
- Adrienne Baker (HN): We're doing themed monthly-ish Early Lit Kits at Herrick that we reference in the virtual storytimes we email out each week. They are specific to baby, toddler, and PreK. They each include a book and tie in with digital resources. We sent out a survey this summer that showed people prefer prerecorded content because it's a little more flexible. Not sure if there's a big difference in how many people are engaging with it now vs. when we were live. By far, our Take & Makes are much more popular! We have some daycares picking them up, as well.
- Mike Golczynski: We were doing craft kits every week, but when school started, the numbers really dropped off, and honestly...I was getting burned out doing them + a corresponding science/instructional video every week. I'm going to switch to monthly. I still do Zoom storytimes on Tuesday and Wednesday. Attendance is....ok. Not as good as it was live. My special Talking is teaching storytime starts tomorrow and I have 17 kids signed up. That's pretty good for Ionia.
